The Annual Hall of Fame and Awards dinner will be held on a Sunday afternoon, September 27th (venue to be announced) and will include all Senior, Open and Women's Tournament winners, CT state high award winners and new Hall of Fame inductees. ### Past CSBA President, Bernie Oppelt, Passes

It was a sad Thanksgiving for the CT bowling world



when it lost one of the most dedicated workers it had with the unexpected passing of former CSBA (CT State Bowling Association) President, Bernard "Bernie" Oppelt. He joined the local CCBA Board in 1985, became a Vice-President from 1992-1997 and President from 1997

to 1999. He served as CSBA President twice in 1997 and 2004. CCBA awarded him lifetime membership in 2001 and he was elected into both the CCBA and CSBA (now CTUSBC) Hall of Fame for Meritorious Service in 2005. He was also a member of the Northeast Council Hall of Fame. He retired from the CCBA board in 2006 upon merging into GCC. He continued to volunteer with GCC and the CTUSBC up until a few days before his death.
