


New Inductees into CT State USBC Hall of Fame Announced



CT State USBC has announced the 4 new inductees into its 2016 class. They are Frank Billowicz, Sr., Monica Schwartz, and Peter Valenti, Jr., all for Superior Performance and Thomas "Frenchie" Gilbert as a Friend of Bowling. All will be honored on Sept. 25th at the Hall of Fame and Awards Brunch at the Marco Polo Restaurant in East Hartford, CT.

Frank Billowitz is in the Fairfield County USBC Hall of Fame and bowls at Nutmeg Lanes in Fairfield. He was their Bowler of he Year in 2009, has been on 5 of their All Star Teams and has 4 Fairfield scratch team titles. He has over seventeen 800 series, over twenty-two 300 games and more than thirty 750 series. His high average is 233. He has bowled in 25 state, 29 local, and 5 national tournaments. He has owned and run a NABI franchise, and served on both local and state boards and was a youth coach and director.





Monica Schwartz is a Fairfield County USBC Hall of Fame member, with many women's scratch titles in their association as well as Greater Danbury USBC and New Haven County USBC in Team, Doubles, Singles and All Events areas. She has been an All Star Team member in all B locals, too. In the CT State USBC Women's Championships she has won 3 Doubles, 2 All Events, 1 Team, and 1 Singles scratch titles. She has the distinction of winning an All Events title in Fairfield in the Open Tournament. She has three 800 series, five 300 games, and dozens of 750, 700,

2016 CT State USBC Annual Meeting

On July 10, 2016, the CT State USBC held its Annual Meeting in West Haven, CT. After breakfast the event started with a memorial service for bowlers of each local who died during the season, presided over by Vice President, Scott Hockford. Sgt.-At-Arms, Tom Kapitan, Sr., ran the flag ceremony with one member from each local participating, then President, Pat Lupacchino called the meeting to order. Various Directors gave their committee reports with discussions and questions following. A new legislation change of raising state dues to \$2 was passed (dues have not changed in 10 years) and elections were held. Director John Turgeon was voted in as 2nd Vice President, Re-elected as directors were Marsha Gilbert, John Marchitto, and Richard Weglinski. Sue Kogelis was elected by youth delegates as a new youth director. Pete Dombrowski was elected to be a state delegate to the 2017 USBC National Convention. Photos are below.







and 650 series. Monica's high average was 223 at Brookfield Lanes in 2008-2009 and 181 in a sports league at Nutmeg Bowl. She has competed in 11 CT State Open and 16 CT State Women's Tournaments as well as NEBA, ABT, TBA, NABI. 19 Nationals, the National Queens, and many of the 3 local association championships

Peter Valenti, Jr., of New Haven County USBC, now joins his father and brother into the CT State Hall of Fame. All 3 are in New Haven's local Hall of Fame, too. In New Haven, Pete, Jr., has also been their Bowler of the Year twice, in 1993 and 1994. He has 2 New Haven scratch titles in Team (2000) and Doubles (2008). On the state level he has 4 championships. Under CSBA, he won a Singles title in 1990 and a Doubles title in 1992. Once CSBA merged with CWBA into CT State USBC, he won 2 Team titles in 2015 and 2016. Peter has a NEBA Doubles win in 2001 at Silver Lanes. To date, he has bowled seven 800 series with a high of 833, thirty 750 series, twenty-two 300 games and 7 each of 299 and 298 games. He holds a high average of 231 Pete has bowled in 34 CT State Open Tournaments, 34 National ABC/USBC Tournaments and the same number of local New Haven Tournaments
