#### **Local Association News**

Greater Central CT USBC had some local records broken or tied recently. On Jan. 6<sup>th</sup> Eric Wells tied the GCC record for high series with 879 at Apple Valley Bowl. On Feb. 13<sup>th</sup>, Scott Widmer, Dave Patterson and Rich Hopkins, set GCC records for both high 3 man team series and team game of 2,435 and 843, respectively, in the Apple Valley Classic League. The series may be a state record and in the top seven nationally, as well. On Feb.14<sup>th</sup>, Steve Yuschak set a high GCC triplicate record with three 279 games in the Spare Time Classic League at the Spare Time Bristol Center. Lessard Lanes youth bowler, Alex Angell, bowled an 869 series on Dec. 3, 2016 with games of 300. 290 and 279. It would have been a new youth record for both GCC and CT State except that it was pre bowled. He had a driver's education lesson to attend. Still great bowling, Alex!

All winners will be honored at their Annual Meeting and Luncheon on June 17<sup>th</sup> in Norwich. Eastern has a new awards program in effect this year. Bowlers are pleased with the shirts they have received for honor scores. Jackets are presented to those bowlers with 300 or 11 strikes in a row. Eastern strives to give awards to all its bowlers.
