

FATHER and SON WIN NATIONAL USBC AWARD



On October 3, 2010, GCC and CTUSBC legend, Roger Baral, and his son Joseph, each rolled a 300 in the same game during a two man team qualifying event in a NEBA doubles tournament in East Providence. Rhode Island. The family duo did not win the competition, but their 300 scores qualified them for a USBC National Team Score recognition relating to scores rolled in certified competitions from August 1, 2010, to July 31, 2011. By the end of that time period, they had placed first in the Two Man National Game category. Their award plaque was delivered to their local GCCUSBC office and Paul DiMauro, GCC association Manager, delivered it to the father and son combo.

These were not the first 300 games for either member of the pair. Roger, a member of both the local GCC and state CTUSBC Hall of Fame, has rolled more than 20 of them in his career. He has a slew of other honor scores and both local and state titles in all areas. Joe, now 22, shot his first 300 game as a junior in 2005 and now has six such games on his impressive record. He's certainly following in his dad's footsteps! Both GCC and CTUSBC congratulate them on their awesome accomplishment of earning a USBC national award!

CPBA & CIAC Meet to Start High School Bowling Program in Connecticut

The CT Bowling Proprietor's Association (CBPA) and CT Interscholastic Athletic Conference (CIAC) met on Dec. 15, 2011 to work together to introduce co-ed high school scholastic bowling programs to CT students by the 2013/2014 season. They hope to start in May of 2012 with an invitational tournament and more to follow the next year to build up interest and support. A committee was formed to develop rules and regulations, posters and flyers, with coaching and transportation issues. The program is considered to be a win-win situation. Students can earn college scholarships, proprietors can increase revenue in late afternoon and weekend hours when there is no league play and local USBC associations can build up memberships as student bowlers eventually join regular leagues as adults. The Chronicle will keep readers informed as more details develop.
