is in the CTUSBC Hall of Fame as a Friend of Bowling. Alyssa is a youth bowler of 10 years, holding a 170 average. At school she belonged to the Wildcat Advisory Group, upperclass students mentoring incoming freshmen, and was a student representative to the Suffield Board of Education. For the past 9 years she volunteered at the local library in the children's room and summer reading program. She improved her Spanish skills as a volunteer at the Springfield Ronald McDonald House and participated in the Relay for Life for 5 years.

Academically, Alyssa took Honors and Advanced Placement courses that earned her over 40 credits at the University of Rhode Island where she will study pharmacy in their six year PharmD Program. CT Bowling Writers Win Again



Matt Perry, of Shelton, CT, has won the prestigious National USBC Chuck Pezzano Scholarship for \$750 for a remarkable second time. Matt won a \$1,500 scholarship in 2011 as was reported in Vol. 6 of the CT Bowler's Chronicle. (Look on CTUSBC

website for back issues.) At that time the program was under the BWAA (Bowling Writers of America Association) and named after nationally known journalist, Chuck Pezzano. BWAA recently merged into IBMA (International Bowling Media Association) which now presents scholarships annually to high school and college youth who study or plan to study and work in some aspect of bowling media and journalism in their future.

Matt currently attends Sacred Heart University in Fairfield where he is involved in several activities. A talented bowler with both a 300 game and 800 series, Matt contributes to the Bowler's Ledger New England newspaper on youth bowling including the Family Night Bowling Organization which he founded and served as President.

Receiving her 3rd award from the BWAA/IBMA is Marsha Gilbert, the CT Bowler's Chronicle newsletter editor. She won 2nd place in their newsletter catgory with an issue of the CT Bowler's Chronicle news-



letter from the 2012 season. She previously won two national BWAA feature story awards in 2010 and 2011.

Marsha has been known among bowlers throughout CT for the past 30 years. She was an ABT Director in the 80's/90's. In 1996 she was among the first females in the state to join ABC when membership opened to women. In 1997, she broke ground in the Central CT Bowling local when appointed the 1st female ABC local director in CT. She became their publicity chair writing for the CT Bowling News periodical and became a BWAA member. When it disbanded she started The CCBA/GCC Chatter in 2001. She was appointed to the CSBA Board that year, becoming the 1st woman on the ABC CT State Board. In s 2011, she was appointed to fill a vacancy on the CTUSBC Board as Communications Chairperson. Marsha started a newsletter for the group that April. She is also the Hall of Fame Chairperson for CTUSBC and GCC. Among her other accomplishments are: 1 scratch CWBA team title, 1 handicap CWBA doubles title, 2 ABT titles, membership in the GCC and Northeast Council Halls of Fame, and cofounder/president of the 1st all women's sport league in the USA which was written about on bowl.com.
